STUDY GUIDE Jo Joe by Sally Wiener Grotta

This study guide is provided free of any charge to book clubs, teachers and others wishing to conduct a group discussion about *Jo Joe*, a Black Bear, Pennsylvania novel by Sally Wiener Grotta.

SUGGESTED QUESTIONS

The following are the author's suggested discussion questions.

- Is there a difference between prejudice and bigotry?
- Do you know anyone of mixed race and/or religion? How do you think their lives are different from yours?
- Do you think Joe made the right choice when they were children? Why?
- If Joe and Judith had married, would it have lasted? Why? What do you think their life together would have been like?
- Why didn't Joe become like his father and brother? Is bigotry and hatred inherited?
- Would the story have been different if they had gone to high school today rather than 20 years ago? In what way?
- Does being Black affect Judith's Judaism? Does being Jewish affect her identity as a Black woman? How?
- How would Judith's life have been different if she had been raised a Christian?
- What do you honestly think of the grandmother? In what ways was she right and/or wrong?

If your group develops other questions that prove to lead to energized, interesting discussions, please share them with us, and we may add them to future iterations of this study guide.

ABOUT JO JOE BY SALLY WIENER GROTTA



Jo Joe is a mystery of the heart about Judith Ormond, a young mixed race Jewish woman. Twenty years earlier, violence and hatred had driven her away from the small Pennsylvanian village where she was raised by her white Christian grandparents. Now, she must break her vow to never return. During the one week visit, she's forced to deal with her first love who cruelly broke her heart and is menaced by an old enemy who threatens new brutalities. But with her discovery of a long-hidden secret that her grandmother had kept from her, Judith finds more questions than answers about the bigotry that scarred her childhood.

ABOUT BLACK BEAR, PENNSYLVANIA

Black Bear is a fictional village in the Poconos Mountains created as a literary *folie à deux* by Sally Wiener Grotta and Daniel Grotta. Both Daniel and Sally are dipping into the same pool of invented locale and characters to write a series of separate stories and novels that will, eventually, paint a full picture of the diversity of life and relationships in a small mountain village. *Honor*, a Black Bear novella by Daniel Grotta was published in 2012. The next Black Bear novel will be *Adam V* by Daniel Grotta, which will be published in 2014.
