....Two weeks later, on June 28, 1961, Lt. Colonel Gasiewicz, Colonel Gorman, Airman Berlett, Captain Fiege, and civilian attorney Samuel C. Borzilleri, who represented Fiege and Berlett's interests, arrived in Washington to meet with officials at the Treasury. According to Fiege, one agent who represented the U.S. Treasury said, "This sounds like Noss stuff." The other Treasury agent present immediately said, "Shut up!" During the meeting, one of the agents, thought to be Secret Service Agent Lilburn "Pat" Boggs, told Fiege and Berlett that the government would never allow either one of them to have the gold.
