Military Families at Naval Station Rota and Moron Air Base Treated to USO Visit From Olympic Medalists Natalie Coughlin and Kim Vandenberg

ARLINGTON, VA (Oct. 8, 2013) – Olympic swimming medalists Natalie Coughlin and Kim Vandenberg showcased their competitive spirit and extended their heartfelt gratitude to military families in Spain as part of a USO tour Oct. 5-9. In the region to show their support to America's Armed Forces, today the pair wrapped up their first ever USO tour at Moron Air Base. The pair first teamed up in 2008 at the Beijing Olympic Games.

DETAILS:

- As part of the USO experience, Coughlin and Vandenberg met with troops and military families stationed at Naval Station Rota and Moron Air Base in Spain. The pair also participated in a military training working dog demonstration, toured a flight line, explored the inside of a C-5 military aircraft and led a swim clinic.
- While onsite, the pair shared insights on what it is like to compete in the Olympic Games and encouraged youth to follow their dreams. The group also encouraged youth to always do their best and extended their heartfelt gratitude.
- Coughlin is the *only* American female athlete to win six medals at a single Olympics (at the 2008 Beijing Olympics) and the first woman in Olympic history to win back-to-back gold medals in the 100m backstroke. She is a 12-time Olympic medalist who left the 2008 Beijing Olympics and 2004 Athens Olympics as the most decorated female athlete. She currently holds more than 49 medals (22 gold, 17 silver and ten bronze). A proud representative of the American Swim Team and the daughter of a veteran police officer, she understands the importance of working hard and having a loved one sacrifice their life to protect others.
- Swimming competitively since the age of 8, Vandenberg is one of the fastest butterfly swimmers in the world. She has competed and medaled at the Olympics, World Championships and Pan American Games. After the Beijing Olympics, she moved to France to compete in European competitions. When she isn't in the pool, Vandenberg is an Ambassador to several nonprofits, an aspiring photographer and swimwear designer.

Not a stranger to working with Olympic athletes, the USO sent 2004 Olympic Gold Medalist
Carly Patterson to Royal Air Force Base Mildenhall in the United Kingdom on August 13, 2012.
Participating in what was her first USO experience, Patterson led tumbling and gymnastics
clinics as well as toddler gym classes for military children.
