Danny Blackgoat is sixteen years old when his Navajo community is burned, his sheep are slaughtered, and

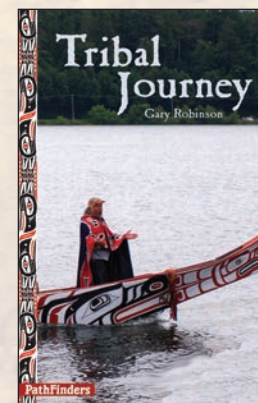

Sixteen-year-old Mississippi Choctaw Randy Cheska lived most of his young life in the shadow of his football-hero

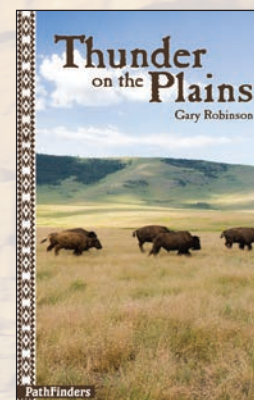
