


WHAT IS ELECTRICITY CHOICE AND HOW DOES IT WORK?

Why do I have a choice?

Deregulation creates choices for the consumer! You can choose who provides your electricity.




More choices means different **companies compete** for your electric business.



Competition between providers **lowers the price you pay** and allows **you to pick the plan** with the features you want.



How does deregulation work?

A Local Utility Company


is responsible for maintaining the wires and transports the electricity to your home

How is electricity priced?

Electricity is priced in cents per kilowatt hour (¢/kWh) or dollars per kilowatt hour (\$/kWh)

What is a kilowatt hour?

One way to think about a kilowatt hour is the amount of electricity needed to keep ten 100 watt light bulbs burning for one hour



A typical home uses about **900kWh per month** for normal lighting, appliances and air conditioning

Pricing: Fixed vs. Variable

Fixed Price

Under this option, you pay a **set price** for electricity supply throughout the term of the contract

- ✓ These rates protect you from increases in electricity prices and help budget your energy costs
- ✗ Contracts typically have termination fees. You end up paying more if energy costs decline

Variable Price

This option allows the supplier to **change the price on a periodic** basis to track the wholesale cost of electricity

- ✓ Contracts don't lock you in to a long-term commitment, so you can switch plans as you please
- ✗ Rates can increase anytime without notice. If you choose this kind of rate you should be willing to monitor rates on a regular basis



Going Green is Easy


If you are looking to protect the environment and support renewable energy you can choose a plan with a high percentage of **renewable energy**.



You can select plans with up to 100% renewable energy from sources like wind and solar.

It is even possible to select an electricity plan from wind farms local to your area, they are labeled *neighborhood* or *regional wind* in ClearlyEnergy's search results.

How Green Plans Support Renewable Energy



The electricity you receive in your home comes from a pool of resources connected to your regional electric grid.

For every unit of electricity generated from a renewable facility, like wind or solar, a corresponding renewable “certificate” is created.

When you choose a green plan your retail electricity provider will purchase enough renewable certificates to match up to your power consumption, greening the grid.



Green-e is the nation's leading independent certification and verification program for renewable energy.

Going Green = Planting Trees

At ClearlyEnergy we make it easy for you to understand the impact of selecting a renewable plan with our *tree equivalents*.

Trees help remove carbon dioxide out of the air and replace it with oxygen.

Renewable resources produce energy with no carbon impact on the atmosphere.

We convert this positive environmental impact into an equivalent number tree seedlings planted and grown for 10 years.



Understanding the Fine Print

Term

Terms vary from a few months to several years. The most common contract length is one year.

Automatic Renewal

It is important to review the renewal terms. Some contracts will automatically renew at the end of the contract term and may change to a variable rate.

Termination Fees

Just like with cell phone plans, some retail electric providers charge a termination fee if you change your plan before your contract is up.

Switching Fees

If you are switching from your local utility there are no fees for selecting a retail electricity provider.

6 things to keep in mind

- » Find out whether you live in a state that offers electricity choice
- » Learn about your local utility offer and its prices
- » Set your priorities to achieve an informed electricity choice: are you focused on savings? The environment? Price stability?
