The race will include awards presented to the top three males and females in the Overall category with additional prizes being awarded to top three male and female finishers in their age divisions. Registered participants will each receive a short-sleeve technical t-shirt and finisher's medal. This is a family-friendly event and will include food and entertainment for race participants and spectators.

The event will benefit the ABC Recovery Center located in Indio, CA. For almost fifty years ABC Recovery Center has been treating individuals with substance abuse problems. ABC Recovery Center provides a complete continuum of care for people who suffer from alcohol and drug addiction, offering high quality, personal treatment plans that are both effective and financially accessible.

This Heroes in Recovery event is the 11th in a series of 6k races that are held across the country to raise awareness and break the stigma associated with addiction treatment and recovery.
