2 Health Insurance – Coverage for Ostomy Equipment and Supplies – Required

3 FOR the purpose of requiring insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and health 4 maintenance organizations that provide certain health insurance benefits under $\mathbf{5}$ certain insurance policies or contracts to provide coverage for certain equipment 6 and supplies used for the treatment of ostomies; requiring the Maryland 7 Insurance Commissioner, in consultation with the Secretary of Health and 8 Mental Hygiene, to adopt by regulation and periodically update a list of certain 9 ostomy equipment and supplies; providing that ostomy equipment and supplies included on a certain list are subject to certain insurance coverage; providing 10 that the required coverage may be subject to certain deductibles and 11 12coinsurance; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to coverage for ostomy equipment and supplies under health insurance. 13
