

The IRC report contains new estimates for 2010, 2011 and 2012.




The IRC estimates uninsured motorists using insurer injury claim data.




The insurance companies that submitted data represent over half of the private passenger vehicle market.

National Findings



The new data shows a downward trend in the uninsured motorist rate, which is a positive sign. However, the total number of uninsured motorists remains elevated.

...are uninsured.




The IRC estimates approximately **29.7 million** are driving uninsured in the U.S.



The IRC estimates that total payments for UM claims amount to \$2.6 billion.


State Findings

- 2. Florida (24%)
- 3. Mississippi (23%)
- 4. New Mexico (22%)
- 5. Michigan (21%)

The estimated number of uninsured motorists is highest in:



- 1. California (4.1 Million)
- 2. Florida (3.2 Million)
- 3. Texas (1.6 Million)
- 4. Ohio (1.3 Million)
- 5. Tennesessee (1.2 Million)
