

BACKGROUND:

The Buffalo Bill Center of the West is a 7-acre museum complex founded by the Buffalo Bill Memorial Association in 1917. The original Buffalo Bill Museum, opened in 1927, has grown immensely over the years to now include five museums that focus on western history, firearms, western art, nature and science of the Yellowstone region, and Plains Indian history and culture. We're located in Cody, Wyoming, founded by William F. "Buffalo Bill" Cody, a man who lived the Old West with buffalo hunting, Pony Express, his Wild West arena show, and an entrepreneur who founded our city. Finally, we're located just 50 miles east of Yellowstone National Park.
