- 75% of donor milk is dispensed by prescription to premature and sick babies in hospitals, 25% to fragile infants at home.
- All donor milk is pasteurized and tested through national scientific guidelines and standards.
- Babies receive donor milk based on medical need, not the ability to pay.

- 5 Human milk has been proven to enhance survivability and decrease complications.
- Human milk banking is older than blood banking and has a safer track record.

- Breastmilk provides nutrition and protection through immunological properties.
- Milk donors are generous mothers who donate surplus milk and are screened free of charge through medical histories and blood tests.
- Because eligible recipients are not charged for donated milk, community financial support is vital for supplementing the rising operating expenses of screening, processing and distribution.

Our Mission

Mothers' Milk Bank of North Texas strives to improve the health and survival of critically ill infants through the safe provision of pasteurized donor human milk.

Celebrating 10 Years of Helping Babies

Since its foundation as a non-profit 501(c) (3) organization in 2003, Mothers' Milk Bank of North Texas has dispensed over 1.8 million ounces from over 4000 donors. And the need continues to grow.

Levels of Giving

- \$25 Provides safe storage for 300 ounces of milk
- \lozenge \$50 Pays for the shipment of milk for one baby at home
- \$100 Covers screening and testing for one donor mom to safely donate milk
- \$500 Screens 5 donor moms to safely donate milk
- \$750 Provides a shipment of milk to a critically ill baby at home
- \$1000 Establishes a milk collection site that receives and stores donated milk for delivery and processing
- ♦ \$3000 Pays courier costs for milk transportation from collection sites to the milk bank for one month

Ryan's Story

Thriving Through the Gift of Donor Milk

children—10 who are adopted. Ryan, the youngest member of the family, was born 8 weeks early with a hypoxic brain injury caused by oxygen deprivation at birth. Now, at 22 months, Ryan receives a shipment of frozen pasteurized donor milk every 10 days from Mothers' Milk Bank of North Texas.

Ryan's twin, Zac, is robust and healthy. However, Ryan began life as a medically fragile baby and spent his first five months in the hospital. For his first 18 months, he had pneumonia every 4 to 6 weeks. Because of his brain injury, his body can't regulate autonomic processes such as swallowing. Therefore, he is continuously fed through a gastrostomy tube and breathes through a tracheostomy tube. Ryan's medical obstacles also include spastic quadriplegic cerebral palsy, auditory neuropathy, vision difficulties and a very sensitive GI tract.

A close family member, who also happens to be a previous milk donor, suggested Crystal approach Ryan's doctor about his eligibility for donor milk. Ryan's medical challenges and his intolerance to formulas and other foods warranted the need for the immunological properties of breastmilk.

After connecting with Mothers' Milk Bank of North Texas for donor milk, Ryan's weight increased and his overall health continues to improve. While Ryan may not ever be able to do all of the things other children his age do, his parents are thrilled that he has learned to roll over and hold his head up, and most of all, that he recognizes and interacts with each person in his family.
