Phase I Project Purpose

"Creating a Culture of Person-Directed Dementia Care" has a project goal to support the continued reduction of antipsychotic medications through person-directed care practices that redefine perceptions of and approaches to dementia care. Choice, dignity, self-determination, and purposeful living are core person-directed values highlighted in regulatory actions, such as the MDS 3.0, the QIS survey process, as well as the CMS initiative to reduce the use of antipsychotic medications. Person-directed care is structured around the unique needs, preferences, and desires of the individual. Through this approach, decisions, and actions around care honor the voices and choices of those accepting care and the people closest to them. Person-directed care education that engages different stakeholders, such as employees in different roles, family members, and the residents themselves, provides a solid foundation for the sustained and successful reduction of antipsychotic medication use over time through non-pharmacological means.

Through person-directed concepts and practical tools, nursing home staff involved in Phase I were empowered to engage other stakeholders in the reduction of antipsychotic use, while improving quality of life and quality of care for those they support. To help meet federal requirements, this project promotes an approach to care for those living with dementia that moves beyond the symptom (challenging behaviors) to identify the unmet needs that cause distress and subsequent medication use.

Expected vs. Actual Outcomes for Phase I

Our expected outcomes for our Phase I Project included the following:

1. Between September 1, 2014 and June 30, 2015, between 400 and 600 nursing home employees will participate in *Dementia Beyond Drugs* training in the State of Oklahoma.

Actual Outcome: We had a total of 350 participants from Oklahoma nursing homes. Therefore, we trained 50 participants fewer than our proposed participation range. Prior to the training events, we had a total of 597 registrants. However, a total of only 350 people actually participated across all three events, (156 in Oklahoma City, 157 in Owasso, and 37 in Enid – and a total of 247 no shows). We believe that it's worth noting that during the week of both the Oklahoma City and the Owasso events, there was severe weather in the form of tornadoes and flooding in both areas. This severe weather likely resulted in a significant number of cancellations. Please refer to Attachment B for registration details. This report reflects registration/participation for nursing home

employees only. We also question whether or not participants value a funded training less (which is at no cost to them) less than one where they have "skin in the game." Should Phase II be funded, we are considering a potential deposit request at the time of registration. This deposit would be refunded at the end of the project, provided participants fulfill all participation expectations. We have learned that there is a precedent for this approach in other states.

2. Between September 1, 2014 and June 30, 2015, up to 50 surveyors and ombudsmen will participate in *Dementia Beyond Drugs* training in the State of Oklahoma.

Actual Outcome: We had 46 ombudsmen/surveyors participate in the training. Therefore, we met our expected outcome of **up to 50** ombudsmen/surveyors participating. Please refer to Attachment C for details. This report reflects registration/participation for state ombudsmen/surveyors.

Even though the grant was written to accommodate registration for only up to 50 ombudsmen/surveyors, we had many more interested in participating in the training. When demand exceeded the available seats for this group of participants, we contacted the surveyor agency directly and asked that they prioritize who should attend. We were pleased to see the high interest from state ombudsmen and surveyors.

3. By the end of the grant period, the project will help effect a 5% overall shift toward person-directed perceptions of, and approaches to, dementia care.

Actual Outcome: We are pleased to report that our evaluation process reveals that participants experienced an overall 9% shift toward person-directed perceptions of and approaches to, dementia care, which is nearly double our proposed outcome of a 5% overall shift in this direction. Please refer to Attachment F, specifically the page entitled "Average Score Core Improvement." Specific data for each of the three events can be found in Attachments G, H, and I.

Methodology for Assessing Overall Shift toward Person-Directed Perceptions
Participants were given a series of survey questions before (pre-test) and after (post-test)
the training events. Please refer to Attachments D and E to see samples of both the pretest and the post-test.

Participants answered on a scale of strongly disagree, disagree, neutral, agree, and strongly agree. Average scores are calculated by assigning the following values: Strongly Agree = 100; Agree = 75; Neutral = 50; Disagree = 25; Strongly Disagree = 0. Thus, all average scores are weighted, so that the more respondents agree, the higher the score. It should be noted, however, that some questions were intended to show movement towards Disagree and Strongly Disagree. Taking this into account, the National Research Corporation (NRC), our objective, third-party evaluator, found the average percent change for all question scores and used that to calculate the overall change in perception.

As with any survey process, there is a margin of error. NRC is confident that the margin is so small that the data is reliable.

Overall Observations

Overall, the results indicate that on all survey questions, training participants' perceptions were moved in the right direction. The trend between pre and post-tests was generally in the direction of a more confident response (i.e. neutral moved toward "Agree" and "Agree" moved closer to "Strongly Agree"). In most cases we also saw a moderate decrease in strong negative responses. For example in Q 22 there was a 1-2% change in the Disagree and Strongly Disagree responses, along with a notable shift from the Neutral and Agree responses to Strongly agree.

Questions Q4, Q8, Q9, Q20, and Q25 were all intended to evoke a shift towards disagreement. In these cases, we took questions that represented institutional attitudes and looked to see if the experience of the training would prompt an answer of "Disagree" or "Strongly Disagree." Overall, these desired shifts were achieved.

Finally, while there were some survey questions that elicited significant shifts in response (Q10 for example), respondents were generally already in agreement with many of the perceptions being tested in the survey. Thus small changes, while not visually obvious in the report, are still significant. For example, in Q14, the four-point shift, when the pretest average was already 90, is significant.

Notable Shifts in the Data

Questions Q4, Q20, Q25 reveal a significant shift away from institutional ways of thinking about dementia care to an approach that is more person-directed. These are important, as they show a direct reversal in many cases of people's previously held beliefs. Q4 is important because the question is medically and factually actuate. However, through the course of the training, participants' perceptions of dementia shifted in such a way that, in the end, they no longer see it purely in the medical sense,

perceiving the experience of dementia more expansively and as much more than just decline and a disease process alone.

Q25 is not only an indicator of changing perceptions, but also demonstrates new training and skills acquired. Q25 shows positively that participants walked away with the sense that they could handle delusions/ hallucinations with something other than medication. This shows that their perceptions were changed (i.e. that "so-called" behaviors are likely caused by an underlying factor or unmet need) and it shows confidence in the training and skills they received (i.e. implementing non-pharmacological solutions).

Additionally, Q20 reveals participants' new awareness that an over-emphasis on safety can interfere with someone's sense of well-being. During the training, participants explore the potential for "surplus safety," which implies that the balance between upside and downside risk can be upset to the degree that opportunity for new experiences is greatly inhibited. This negatively impacts quality of life and peace of mind and could result in unrest and discontent for the individual living with dementia.

Questions Q7, and Q5 both represent a strong shift in perspective. The shift captured in Q5 is very much tied to that associated with Q4 (moving away from the notion that dementia is just a progressive, irreversible, and fatal disease process.) When participants begin to understand that people living with dementia are still able to learn, grow, and give as well as receive, they open to more creative ways to respond to and interact with those who live with dementia, that specifically enhance overall well-being (which involves a sense of identity, connectedness, security, growth, autonomy, meaning, and joy). By addressing these seven domains of well-being, care partners are better prepared to respond to unmet needs, which are often at the root of certain reactions and responses and can lead to unnecessary use of medication.

Q21 reflects an awareness of new tools that can enhance well-being for someone living with dementia. This question shows an almost 20 point shift, indicating that most people realized by the end of the training that there is always an underlying cause that can be assessed. In turn, unnecessary use of medication can again be reduced.

Long-Term Impact and Sustainability of Phase I Activities

When polled about whether *Dementia Beyond Drugs* training provided the tools and insight to improve care for individuals living with dementia, the vast majority of participants responded "Definitely." We estimate that thousands of residents will reap the benefits of this training and its associated materials, given **the participation of 121 nursing homes** from around the state. This does not include the future residents who will be welcomed into these homes over time, who will benefit from the person-directed practices developed through this project's educational component. Additional long-term impacts may include, but are not limited to: 1) The Implementation Protocol and Hand in Hand Crosswalk Tool (both distributed in hard copy to each participant at the training), as well as the application of new person-directed, dementia care skills can be

disseminated throughout each organization, utilized, and maintained over time; 2)The Eden Alternative Domains of Well-Being can be applied over time to frame conversations addressing challenges faced by those who live with dementia and their care partners; 3) Participating residents and family members can help infuse new concepts into the admission and employee orientation processes; 4) Periodic formal review involving all stakeholders can help identify and remove potential barriers to application of the skills; and 5) Tools, strategies, and implementation protocols developed during the project can be internally replicated repeatedly on several levels.

We also plan to send a follow up email to training participants by July 15, 2015, providing them with electronic versions of the Implementation Protocol, the Hand in Hand Crosswalk Tool, and our white paper detailing application of the Eden Alternative Domains of Well-Being entitled "Revolutionizing the Experience of Home by Bringing Well-Being to Life." This will hopefully remind participants of what they have, offer the material in another format, and remind them to put these tools to use.

Grant Project Process Review

At the end of our Phase I Project, team members came together and brainstormed what aspects of our process really worked and what could use improvement. This is a living document that we intend to develop further over time. Below, we've provided a detailed exploration of what we've considered so far about the project process. "What Worked" essentially reflects some of the process strengths that we are prepared to build on for the proposed Phase II of our project, should funding be approved. "Lessons Learned" captures those matters needing adjustment, as well as specific suggestions for refining them.

What Worked

Locating two of the events in Oklahoma City and Tulsa/Owasso ended up working well.

Working toward a crystal clear description of expectations for project partners helped a lot.

Limiting registration to funded participants through the use of an access code for qualified registrants.

Verifying each funded registrant through confirmation that his/her place of employment could be found on the list of potentially qualified organizations. Increasing the number of verifications as we got closer to an event worked well too.

The informational webinars were a nice, personal touch and handy to include the recording links in promotional materials going forward.

Creating an articulated promotion schedule with our project partner was good.

Use of multiple table guides/facilitators really helped. We were able to more effectively support small group exercises effectively. Plus, they supported other processes, such as evaluation, materials distribution, registration support, and sign-ins.

Lessons Learned

We didn't need three locations for training. Enid enrollment was staggeringly low from the beginning. When we reached out to participants, we learned that many who lived closer to Enid were planning attending training in Oklahoma City or the Tulsa area.

We need to find better ways to distribute the access code, so that we get it to as many eligible people as possible without giving it to ineligible people inadvertently.

We need to use a separate registration for each event, so registrants only get information about their specific training event.

We need to find more creative ways to promote the informational webinars and feature satisfied participants from Phase I in the webinars for Phase II.

We could use some more training and coordination of the table guides prior to the events so they are fully prepared for their role.

When we set up the registration process, all new registrations should be designated as "pending status" until eligibility is verified. We should then confirm each registration with a package of information about the event.

We had more surveyors/ombudsmen interested in the opportunity than we had seats for. Contacting the survey agency directly and requesting they prioritize who should attend was a smart solution. The survey agency gave us positive feedback for taking this approach.

It makes a difference to have the same OFMQ/EA representatives at each location.

Organization of materials for facilitators/table guides was excellent and helped save time.

Hiring a resource to call eligible nursing homes was essential to reach organizations not yet registered, because so many of them had not yet seen promotional materials for whatever reason.

It was helpful to create and provide template promotional materials for our project partners.

We should use a separate registration type for ombudsman/surveyors, which would allow us to put in a registration cap as needed.

Email blasts from OFMQ and the State Health Department achieved the best results (better than those initiated by our organization). If Phase II is approved, we should request more email activity to support registration from both of these partners.

Make sure we have totally current and updated registration lists on the first day of each training event to use for the sign in process.

Need to look at the process for signing people in and out each day at training to make sure it is quick, efficient, and we get everyone.














