World Allergy Organization begins XXIV World Allergy Congress (WAC 2015) in Seoul, Korea WAC 2015 will highlight unmet needs in allergy research and patient care

Seoul, Korea. October 14, 2015 – The World Allergy Organization (WAO) officially commences the XXIV World Allergy Congress (WAC 2015) in Seoul, Korea today through 17 October, in collaboration with the Korean Academy of Asthma, Allergy and Clinical Immunology (KAAACI) and their mutually collaborating partner the Asia Pacific Association of Pediatric Allergy, Respirology and Immunology (APAPARI). The program offers a wide range of topics, from immunotherapy to precision medicine for allergy and asthma. It also highlights unmet needs and future challenges in order to encourage advancements that will lead to improved patient care, as the prevalence, severity, and complexity of allergic diseases are increasing worldwide.

"Prevalence of asthma in Asia alone has increased from 0.8% to 29.1%, and allergic rhinitis from 5% to 45%" said Lanny Rosenwasser, MD, President of the World Allergy Organization and the Chair of the WAC 2015 Scientific Program. "Around the world, physicians are seeing an increase in allergy symptoms and associated disorders. We need to investigate the underlying causes and continue the search for new diagnostic and treatment approaches for allergic disease and asthma as well as the means for prevention."

WAC 2015 expects to gather over 2000 attendees from over 76 countries to explore the state-of-the-art of allergy medicine. The scientific program will offer a wide variety of courses and subjects: 4 plenary sessions, 4 keynote lectures, 14 new horizon sessions, 10 pediatric tracks, 17 workshops, 24 symposia, 4 poster sessions, and 9 oral abstracts, all delivered by a faculty of over 200 internationally known experts. Seven-hundred-sixty-one abstracts were accepted from clinicians around the world, 31 of those received an "Outstanding Abstract Award," and 25 travel grants have been award to junior clinicians.
