Drag and drop from your list of clients right to the calendar. Adjust the appointment time and the CPT code adjusts automatically.



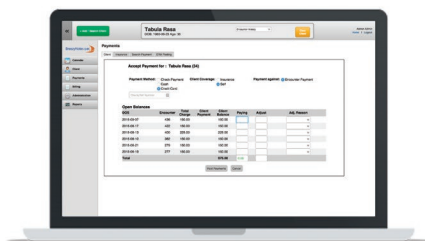
Write the Note
