Worcester, MA (November 19, 2015) Celebrate the holiday season at The Hanover Theatre with New England's largest and most spectacular production of *A Christmas Carol*, December 18-27, 2015. Adapted and directed by Troy Siebels, president & CEO of The Hanover Theatre, this Charles Dickens classic has quickly become a family holiday tradition, warming the hearts of many throughout central New England. Theatregoers will be embraced by a warm, inviting experience from the moment they walk in the door.

Generously sponsored by Blue Cross Blue Shield of Massachusetts and MassLive, the eighth annual production of *A Christmas Carol* will be performed to the music of the Mighty Wurlitzer organ, New England's largest theatre pipe organ containing over 2,400 pipes. The organ offers audience members a unique sound, providing more breadth and variety to the production. A trademark of Siebels' production of *A Christmas Carol* is that it is tweaked and revised each year to keep the show young and fresh. "The production has been such an audience pleaser that it is a continuous challenge to try to find new things to improve from year to year," said Siebels, "We do have a few new things up our sleeve for 2015!"

Many veteran actors will be returning to reprise their roles in the 2015 production. Most notable are Jeremy Lawrence and Marc Geller, who will portray Ebenezer Scrooge and Jacob Marley respectively. Both Lawrence and Geller have received high praise from critics for their past performances from critics and are sure to deliver highlight moments in this year's show.
