Donald Davis is frequently recognized as a gifted performance artist and "one of the most popular figures on today's storytelling circuit" (LA Times). Davis's humor, compassion, and ability to read audiences has earned him such honors as the NSN ORACLE Circle of Excellence and Lifetime Achievement awards. *The New York Times* wrote that "his stories often left listeners limp with laughter at the same time they struggled with a lump in the throat." Davis is also a prolific author and has written over ten titles with August House, including the award winning LittleFolk picture book *The Pig Who Went Home on Sunday: An*

The Mariposa Storytelling Festival runs from March 11-13 and will feature Donald Davis on March 11th. The Azalea Storytelling Festival runs from March 4-6 and will feature Davis on March 6th. The Florida Storytelling festival runs from March 31-April 4 and will feature Davis on March 31st.
