## **TESOL International Association Installs new President, Board Members**

Alexandria, VA (20 April 2016) – TESOL International Association, the professional association for English language educators worldwide, recently installed Dr. Dudley Reynolds as its new president along with four new board members at the TESOL International Convention & English Language Expo held 5-8 April 2016 in Baltimore, Maryland USA.

Reynolds teaches first-year writing and is a member of the Dean's Academic Council at <u>Carnegie Mellon University in Qatar</u>. He has an extensive background in the field of TESOL, where he has taught in MA TESOL, intensive English, and elementary school programs. His research focuses on the development, instruction, and assessment of second language literacy. Reynolds will serve a one-year term as TESOL International Association's 51<sup>st</sup> president.
