LONG ISLAND CITY, QUEENS – Urban Upbound CEO and Co-Founder Bishop Mitchell Taylor was joined by Reverend Patrick H. Young, Resident leaders, non-profit partners and members of the community to urge low-income New Yorkers and NYCHA public housing residents to take advantage of the city's free Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) sites all around New York City. Free VITA sites enable qualified working families and individuals to take advantage of the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and the Child Tax Credit (CTC) both of which provide a particularly important lifeline in tough economic times. Urban Upbound has 26 tax sites in and around NYC and residents must call to make an appointment to receive free tax preparation. On the filing deadline – Tuesday, April 18th, 2017 from 9:00am to 9:00pm, Urban Unbound will hold its Third Annual 12 hour, Free Tax Preparation Services Marathon at their Long Island City Free Tax Prep VITA Site located at 12-15 40th Avenue in Long Island City, Queens –giving New York City's low-income and public housing communities' the opportunity to take advantage of these vital resources.

Senator Michael Gianaris said, "With tax season coming to an end, I encourage all those who have not filed their taxes to do so. With access to services such as "Free Volunteer Income Tax Assistance," filling taxes is easy and affordable. I thank Urban Upbound for once again providing our community with tax preparation services."

About Bishop Mitchell Taylor - Co-Founder and Chief Executive Officer at Urban Upbound. Bishop Taylor has lived in and around Queensbridge Houses most of his life. In 1987 under the direction of his Father the late Bishop Moses Taylor he founded Astoria Outreach Ministries in Astoria, New York, focusing primarily on the youth in Astoria Houses. In 1991 he was installed as Senior Pastor of the Center of Hope International (COHI), a nondenominational church adjacent to the Queensbridge Houses. In 2004, Bishop Taylor cofounded Urban Upbound, formerly known as the East River Development Alliance (ERDA). Bishop Taylor served as a commissioner on the Civilian Complaint Review Board and has been profiled by The New York Times, CNN, National Public Radio, and other leading media outlets for his leadership around public housing, and has received prestigious awards including the New York City Public Library's Brooke Astor Award, NYC Neighborhood Achievement Leadership Award, and the Jewish Community Relations Council of New York Martin Luther King Award. Bishop Taylor was also a participant in the United Way Executive Fellows Program and was chosen to participate in the highly competitive Achieving Excellence in Community Development program led by NeighborWorks and Harvard University Kennedy School of Government. Bishop Taylor is the author of Unbroken Promises, published by Whitaker House (2003).
