Radon is an oderless gas that comes from the decay products of uranium in the ground beneath buildings. It seeps into your home through cracks, sumps, joints, basement drains or other tiny openings in foundations.

The Citizens for Radioactive Radon Reduction, a non-profit organization dedicated to reducing lung cancer due to radon, wants to help you estimate your radon exposure and the risk it poses to your health.

Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer after smoking. It can significantly increase the risk for never smokers and for smokers as well. There are over 21,000 deaths / yr from radon-related lung cancer.

Donations and volunteer expert services have made it possible for us to offer Free advanced radon measurements* to individuals, their family or friends who want to know what their radon exposure is at home and what can be done about it.

Because some people find current radon measurement technologies challenging to use and difficult to interpret, we are studying the effectiveness of a new, easier radon measuring method compared to those older conventional methods. We also hope that your participation may spark some interest and awareness of radon exposure and lung cancer risk in your community. All testing is filed with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).
