Comments can be misconstrued, imminent danger can be inferred, and sometimes hoaxes happen. As such, tips are given a risk assessment, using multiple resources to verify any information provided. This way, schools won't be alerted to song lyrics or movie dialogue excerpts.

Due deliberation goes into our alerts, something automated systems simply cannot do.

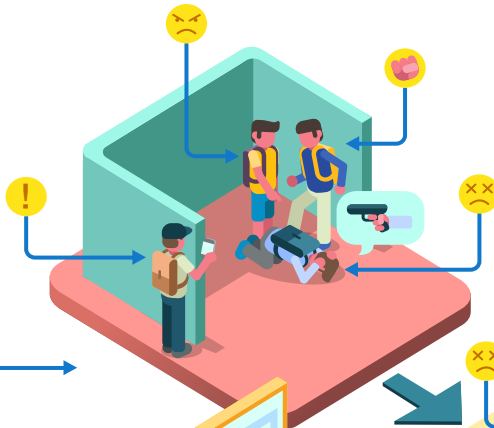


Kids can stand up to school violence



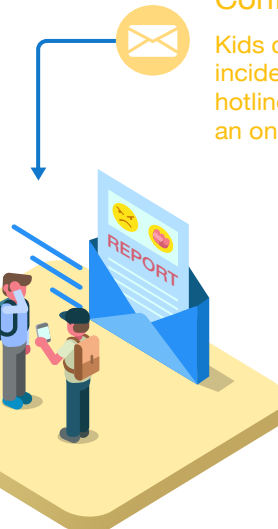
Conflict is Witnessed

When kids see bad things happening, they know that physically intervening will only make things worse. They can still do something about it.



Conflict is Reported

Kids can anonymously report the incident to Tipline by calling the hotline, sending an email, through an online form, or sending a text.



Conflict is Analyzed

The Tipline team applies a risk assessment to each report, then immediately alerts districts to situations that are deemed urgent.



Conflict is Resolved

Because an adult was alerted, an incident that might otherwise go unnoticed is addressed directly, and the cycle of violence is stopped.
