The courses utilize case-based learning to educate providers on the importance of risk stratification, how to recognize the factors contributing to risk and which tools to utilize for stratification. As a result, providers will be equipped to engage in shared decision-making with patients to develop personalized prevention and management plans.

COURSE 1 RISK STRATIFICATION
