Over the course of their personal and professional partnership, they studied, wrote about, and advised on virtually every facet of our modern world. Together, Alvin and Heidi Toffler predicted and documented the dramatic evolution of the knowledge-based economy that replaced the Industrial Age. This Third Wave has shaped everything from our most personal lives, to society, culture, politics, enterprise, innovation, security, infrastructure, and even the frontiers of space.

The Tofflers’ influential writings include articles for *The Washington Post* and *Fortune*, to books including *Future Shock*, *The Third Wave*, and *Revolutionary Wealth*, which have been translated into dozens of languages and are bestsellers in more than 30 countries. The books have earned their place in the American non-fiction lexicon by synthesizing complicated concepts of change to make them useful predictors of the future.

Around the world, political and military leaders, economists, business leaders, musicians, and individuals continue to rely on their insights to understand, plan, and adapt to the increasingly rapid changes shaping our modern existence. Alvin served as a visiting professor at Cornell University, a faculty member of the New School for Social Research, and a visiting professor at the Russell Sage Foundation. Heidi served on the Scientific Advisory Committee of the Pio Manzu Research Center in Italy and on the U.S. Committee for the United Nations Fund for Women. They both have received numerous prestigious awards and honors for their work around the world.

Alvin and Heidi Toffler are the source of legacy and future for Toffler Associates. We extend his curiosity, methodologies, and passion to the organizations we support in becoming Future Proof[®] as we move through this knowledge age and into a complex future.

- 1928** Alvin Toffler is born October 4 in New York.
 - 1929** Adelaide (Heidi) Anders Farrell is born August 1 in New York
 - 1946** Alvin and Heidi meet while studying at New York University
 - 1950** Alvin and Heidi marry.
 - 1950** Alvin and Heidi spend five years as blue collar workers to study industrial mass production.
 - 1953** In her role as UAW union shop steward, Heidi leads integration of community swimming pool for company picnic
 - 1954** Alvin and Heidi have their only child, a daughter named Karen.
 - 1960s** Alvin begins his writing career –
Begins with a union-backed newspaper, then as a correspondent covering the White House and Congress
Becomes a columnist for Fortune, first writing about labor then business and management
 - 1962** Plants the seeds for an influential technology thought leadership and advisory role –
Crafts a paper about the social and organizational impact of computers for IBM
Covers the Xerox research laboratory
Advises AT&T about the future of telecommunications
 - 1965** *The Culture Consumers*, the first book for Alvin and Heidi Toffler, is published.
 - Mid-1960s** Alvin and Heidi begin work on the manuscript that would become the book *Future Shock*.
 - 1970** *Future Shock* is published.
 - 1970** Awarded the McKinsey Foundation Book Award for Contributions to Management Literature.
 - 1972** Awarded the prestigious Prix du Meilleur Livre Etranger in France.
 - 1973** *Learning for Tomorrow* is published.
 - 1975** *The Eco-Spasm Report* is published.
 - 1976** Alvin Toffler testifies at the U.S. Senate Foreign Relations Committee about the growing state of internationalization.
 - 1980** *The Third Wave* is published.
 - 1983** *Previews and Premises* is published.
 - 1985** *The Adaptive Corporation* is published.



- 1986** Then-Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev calls on Alvin and Heidi to help create the first non-governmental, non-Communist Party organization in the U.S.S.R. since the 1917 Communist Revolution.
 - 1989** *The Third Wave*, a best seller in China, is praised by revolutionary and statesman Deng Xiaoping and then-prime minister Zhao Ziyang. During the Tiananmen Square uprising, it is hailed as the reformers' "Bible" and remains known as "the book that changed China."
 - 1990** *Powershift* is published.
 - 1990s** Architect of the new Singapore, Lee Kwan Yew resigns as Prime Minister. He cites *Powershift* as a key influence on his decades of effort to build a prosperous new country. Former Prime Minister L.K. Advani declares his reliance on the Tofflers' works. Nobel Laureate (2000) and then South Korean president Kim Dae-jung asks the Tofflers to serve as his personal advisors.
 - 1993** *War and Anti-War* is published.
 - 1994** *Creating a New Civilization: The Politics of the Third Wave* is published.
 - 1995** Newly appointed senator Newt Gingrich compels Congress to read Toffler.
 - 1996** Toffler Associates is founded to guide governments and businesses working to transform their organizations to be Future Proof®.
 - 2000** Alvin and Heidi's daughter, Karen, passes away at age 46 from Guillian-Barre syndrome.
 - 2006** *Revolutionary Wealth* is published.
 - 2006** Receive Brown University Independent Award. Joins Mikhail Gorbachev, Margaret Thatcher, Steve Jobs, and Ted Turner as past recipients.
 - 2010** At the 40th Anniversary of *Future Shock*, worldwide coverage confirms the accuracy and impact of the book and of the Tofflers' work as futurists.
 - 2016** Alvin Toffler passes away at the age of 87 at his home in California.
 - 2019** Heidi Toffler passes away at the age of 89 at her home in California
