Highmark Health **Economic Impact Study**



Highmark Health is the second largest integrated delivery and finance system and one of the most diversified. Across the nation, Highmark Health's total economic impact reached more than \$18 billion dollars supporting 112,000 jobs, both direct and indirect, across its core markets. In other words, Highmark Health sustains nearly two additional jobs for every direct employee.

The company has also generated more than \$924 million dollars in state and local tax revenues in the states where it operates.

This study looks at the direct economic impact of Highmark Health as a result of its spending. It also focuses on how that direct impact leads to induced and indirect spending in the economy.

Economic impact begins when an organization spends money.

Direct economic impact stems from inarea spending of the items like capital improvements, goods and services, as well as day-to-day operational costs.

Indirect impacts are derived from direct spending, which are received as income and then recirculated throughout the economy.
