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Meet the Author – DANIEL FRIEDMANN

Daniel Friedmann P.Eng., M.A.Sc., a Readers' Favorite 2013 International Book Award Winner, studies the origin of the universe and life on earth from both the scientific and biblical perspectives. His work on reconciling the biblical account with scientific observation utilizing his biblical clock formula has been reported in conferences, various newspapers, magazines, television and radio talk shows.

He is Chairman of Carbon Engineering, a company dedicated to removing co2 from the air to solve climate change. 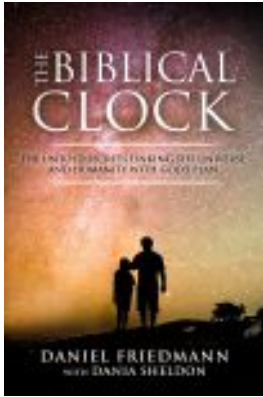

It is a stand-alone volume and in relating the story of discovery covers the essential materials in the earlier trilogy.

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Book Excerpt The Biblical Clock

CHAPTER 1: FROM Acre to Angels Acre, 1291, to Spain, 1305

On the evening of Thursday, May 17, 1291, Isaac ben Samuel carefully put away several manuscripts and his writing implements, extinguished the candles on his desk, and lay down, still fully clothed, for what would be a last, uneasy sleep in Crusader held Acre . The rumbling and crashes of the catapults had ceased some two hours earlier, and as the city of about 35,000 souls withdrew indoors with the onset of dusk, the sounds of its walls crumbling were painfully audible.

The siege of Acre by Al-Ashraf Khalil of the Bahriyya Mamluks had continued for forty-two days, and Isaac ben Samuel felt the city's fall was imminent. Some of his rabbinical colleagues opined that the siege would last forty-nine days, at which time a divinely sent disaster would befall the Muslims and the city would be delivered.

Isaac was a man of deep faith and already well advanced in deciphering the mysteries of scripture, but he wasn't a fool. Such a miracle might occur—or it might not, in which case he had to be prepared to flee what would certainly be the ensuing massacre. He had packed his most valued manuscripts, both his own writings and those of others, in a large satchel that was not so bulky or heavy as to prevent him from running through narrow streets.

Many of the city's Jews had taken to spending most of their time in the synagogues, and Isaac's close friend Jacob had urged him to come to the one in their neighborhood. Jacob and about 500 others would be staying there overnight, as their homes were close to the city walls and they sought the comfort of distance and numbers. Isaac had agreed to join them at first light to pray and then discuss what they would do if the city fell. "When, not if," he muttered as he drifted into a shallow sleep.

He was jolted awake before dawn by thundering drums. Not close by, yet so loud that they seemed to fill the air. As he opened the shutters, the booming broke over him like an invisible wave. It had begun: the Mamluks' final assault.

Isaac hurriedly gulped down a large cup of water, grabbed his satchel, and headed out into the street, toward the synagogue, a mile distant. A few hundred yards from his destination, he began to hear screams and smelled burning timber. In less than a minute, black-gray billows were tainting the rosy dawn sky. He broke into a jog, rounded a corner that led to the square surrounding the synagogue, then nearly fell in his haste to stop and retreat into a shallow alcove. Mamluk soldiers had already made it to the square, and the stony ground had begun to steam with freshly shed blood. The buildings bordering the square were ablaze.

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Book Excerpt The Biblical Clock

CHAPTER 1: FROM Acre to Angels Acre, 1291, to Spain, 1305

Most of the synagogue's occupants who had ventured out at the sound of the drums had been prevented from reentering when the Muslim fighters streamed into the adjacent streets. Those who remained inside—mostly women, children, and the very elderly—swiftly found themselves barricaded within their erstwhile sanctuary. Knowing he should flee, Isaac nonetheless remained fixed in mute horror as the soldiers set the synagogue alight in several places, pouring on oil to encourage the flames. The shrieks and stench were appalling, and years later, writing of that day, he still flinched in remembrance of the man-devouring inferno and could hear, smell, and taste it all again.

Within three hours, the city was completely overrun and the Mamluks claimed victory over Acre. Every Christian found was slaughtered, and most Jews as well. The city was razed so thoroughly that thirty years later, a Syrian geographer who had visited Acre wrote that it was still largely in ruins.

We don't know what distinguished Isaac as someone to be spared, but he was. It may have been that as a well-educated man, he was regarded as having potential value. We know that he was taken prisoner and eventually ransomed, although when or by whom remains unclear, so he did prove to be more useful to the Mamluks alive than dead.

For a century, Acre had been in Crusader hands. Although factional disputes had broken out among them during that time, leading to the occasional civil war, Acre had thriven, becoming a prosperous commercial center in the Eastern Mediterranean region. It was also strategically important as a heavily fortified gateway to the Holy Lands and was accordingly well maintained. By the time of the siege, it was the Crusaders' last major stronghold in their Kingdom of Jerusalem, so its fall to the Muslims, and their ensuing near-obliteration of its structures and inhabitants, put an end to any further crusades to the Levant. The city's contemporary prominence meant that numerous accounts of its annihilation survive.

Author Interview Q & A The Biblical Clock

1. Provide me with 3 Key Message Points of the book:

Science and religion-based knowledge is not at odds.
Combining both bodies of knowledge, we can get a better understanding.
We can estimate the timing of future events from the cosmic plan and actual history.

2. What do you think will surprise readers the most?

That the timeline for the development of the universe as detailed by science and as contained in the Bible, match; and that the Bible says science will be able to understand everything that happened in the development of the universe except one thing: the beginning. The instant before the Big Bang theory begins to work.

3. What is your best advice for beginning writers?

Try this book first. According to reviewers, it's an easy narrative to follow type of book.

4. How long did it take to do the research, write the book, and have it published?

This book includes research from my 3 prior books. In total 10 years of work. It took about eight months to write and a year to publish as it went to many reviewers for feedback and had many revisions before publication

5. Who is the audience for this book, primarily?

It's for a general audience. Anybody with an interest, no prior scientific or biblical training required.

6. Why would any scientist need to consider biblical sources to answer the creation of the universe and the human origins question? Aren't we certain we evolved?

As science has studied our origins, we have understood much of what happened but at the same time some questions have remained unanswered and, in some cases, deepened in mystery. Today, some scientists are concerned that maybe we can't get at all the answers. The Bible explains that science will be able to obtain all answers except just 3. Those three remain the biggest unanswered questions today. Yet the Bible has lots to say about them.

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Author Interview Q & A The Biblical Clock

7. How does Genesis 1 and the evolution of human history reveal the events and timing for the End of Days?

In short, the Bible contains the structure of the Divine plan for history. We have experienced and documented 1000's of years of history. When we place actual historical events on the Divine structure, a pattern immediately emerges. Once we know the pattern, we can make sense of the prophetic writings and glimpse at what's next.

Is the End of Days soon? Yes, it's a process that will take time but should begin to be totally obvious in the next 20 to 30 years. Today, with the aid of this book, one can see the early events already.

8. Why would any believer read this book?

Because many believers are aware that science seems incompatible with the Bible. Yet they are also well aware that science works. So, they need to see and understand that there is no incompatibility. Also, science and history shed much light on the Bible itself.

9. Why would any nonbeliever read this book?

Because they may be aware that some questions are not being answered by science and certainly the future is uncertain. This book sheds light on these topics.

10. How can one even compare religion and science on this issue? They come from very different points of view.

The views are not that different. Science tries to understand what we have and how it came about. Like looking at a house and seeing what's its built of and how it might have been built. Religion claims to have the Creator's notes; like the architectural blueprint. Now, to the unaided eye, the blueprint does not look anything like the house but with some training it does tell about the house. The same is true in comparing science and biblical texts.

11. How does this book affect other religions?

The book is based primarily on Genesis and some other books of the Bible. All of these are shared with Christianity and most with Islam. For non-Abrahamic religions, the book shows and approaches the issues but does not go into their scriptures.
