e are now accepting nominations for the 2021 Fred J. Epstein Youth Achievement Award, a \$1,000 award that recognizes the strengths and accomplishments of young people with learning disabilities and ADHD. It will be given to a student 19 or younger who has demonstrated initiative, talent and determination resulting in a notable accomplishment in any field—including art, music, science, math, athletics or community service. Honorable Mentions will also be awarded.

The award will be presented either virtually or in person at the annual Smart Kids with Learning Disabilities Benefit at a time and place to be determined. Transportation and hotel accommodations will be provided for the winning student and his/her parents if the Benefit is held in person.

The winner of the 2020 Award is Zachary Rice of Long Valley, NJ. What kept Zach going during his long and painful recovery from a destructive hip infection was relying on his ADHD to make life more bearable for other hospitalized children. He credits his ADHD with allowing him to focus intensely on creating the Action for Distraction 5K event, raising money for the Goryeb Children's Hospital in Morristown, NJ.

Valerie Reown of Baltimore, MD won a Special Recognition Award. Carson Guzman of Wayne, NJ was presented with a Junior Youth Achievement Award, while five Honorable Mentions were also awarded.
