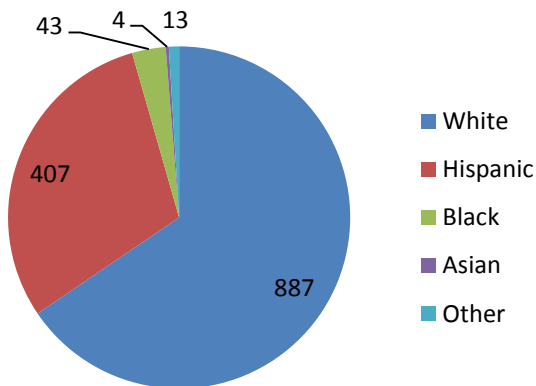

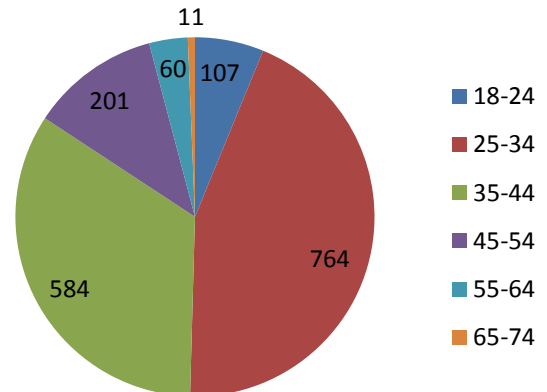

The pilot program formally launched on September 1, 2019 in Essex, Franklin, Hampden, Hampshire, Middlesex, Norfolk and Suffolk counties in Massachusetts following a year-long design and implementation process. As part of the pilot, individuals entering facilities in the seven counties on any of the three FDA-approved MAT regimens (buprenorphine, methadone or naltrexone) will have the ability to continue their treatment regimen while incarcerated, unless determined otherwise by a qualified addiction specialist. Sentenced inmates not on a verified MAT regimen at the time of their commitment may also be evaluated for participation 30 days prior to their scheduled release.
