IMPRISONMENT

The defendant is hereby committed to the custody of the United States Bureau of Prisons to be imprisoned for a term of 87 MONTHS ON COUNT 1.

The Court makes the following recommendations to the Bureau of Prisons:

- 1) The defendant shall receive educational and vocational training while incarcerated.
- 2) The defendant shall receive an evaluation for the need of substance abuse treatment and anger management counseling while incarcerated.
- 3) The Court recommends that the defendant be housed as close to his/her family as possible.

The defendant shall surrender for service of the sentence at the institution designated by the Bureau of Prisons/U.S. Marshal, as directed by the Bureau of Prisons.

If the defendant is not notified by the Bureau of Prisons of the institution designated, the defendant shall report to the United States Marshal at 600 Granby Street, Norfolk, VA, by 10:00 a.m. on September, 21, 2021, to begin service of the sentence.

SUPERVISED RELEASE

Upon release from imprisonment, the defendant shall be on supervised release for a term of 3 YEARS on Count 1.

The Probation Office shall provide the defendant with a copy of the standard conditions and any special conditions of supervised release.

The defendant shall report to the probation office in the district to which the defendant is released within 72 hours of release from the custody of the Bureau of Prisons.

The defendant shall not commit another federal, state or local crime.

The defendant shall not unlawfully possess a controlled substance. The defendant shall refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. The defendant shall submit to one drug test within 15 days of release from imprisonment and periodic drug tests thereafter, as determined by the court.

The defendant shall not possess a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or any other dangerous weapon.

If this judgment imposes a fine or restitution obligation, it is a condition of supervised release that the defendant pay any such fine or restitution in accordance with the Schedule of Payments set forth in the Criminal Monetary Penalties sheet of this judgment.

STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

The defendant shall comply with the standard conditions that have been adopted by this court set forth below:

- the defendant shall not leave the judicial district without the permission of the court or probation officer;
- the defendant shall report to the probation officer and shall submit a truthful and complete written report within the 2) first five days of each month;
- the defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the probation officer and follow the instructions of the probation officer;
- the defendant shall support his or her dependents and meet other family responsibilities;
- the defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation, unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, 5) training, or other acceptable reasons;
- the defendant shall notify the probation officer at least ten days prior to any change in residence or employment;
- the defendant shall refrain from excessive use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute, or administer any narcotic or other controlled substance or any paraphernalia related to such substances, except as prescribed by a physician;
- the defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered;
- the defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony, unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer;
- 10) the defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view of the probation officer;
- 11) the defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer;
- 12) the defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer for a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court;
- 13) as directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defendant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

While on supervised release pursuant to this Judgment, the defendant shall also comply with the following additional special conditions:

- 1) The defendant shall pay for the support of his children in the amount ordered by any social service agency or court of competent jurisdiction, and shall register with the department of child support enforcement in any state in which the defendant resides.
- 2) The defendant is prohibited from engaging in any employment where he would have access to money.
- 3) The defendant shall apply all monies received from income tax refunds, lottery winnings, inheritances, judgements, and any anticipated or unexpected financial gains, to the outstanding court-ordered financial obligation, or in a lesser amount to be determined by the court, upon the recommendation of the probation officer.
- 4) The defendant shall not incur new credit charges or open additional lines of credit without the approval of the probation officer.
- 5) The defendant shall provide the probation officer access to any requested financial information.
- 6) The offender shall participate in the Treasury Offset Program (TOP) as directed by the probation officer.
- 7) If the defendant tests positive for a controlled substance or shows signs of alcohol or substance abuse, he shall participate in a program approved by the United States probation office for alcohol or substance abuse, which program may include residential treatment and testing to determine whether the defendant has reverted to the use of drugs or alcohol, with partial cost to be paid by the defendant, all as directed by the probation officer.
- 8) The defendant shall waive all rights of confidentiality regarding substance abuse treatment or anger management counseling in order to allow the release of information to the United States Probation Office and authorize communication between the Probation Officer and the treatment provider.
- 9) The defendant shall participate in anger management counseling.

SCHEDULE OF PAYMENTS

Having assessed the defendant's ability to pay, payment of the total criminal monetary penalties is due as follows:

The special assessment and restitution shall be due in full immediately. Any balance remaining unpaid on the special assessment and restitution at the inception of supervision shall be paid by the defendant in installments of not less than \$500 per month or 25% of net income, whichever is greater, until paid in full. Said payments shall commence 60 days after defendant's supervision begins.

Any special assessment payments may be subject to penalties for default and delinquency.

Unless the court has expressly ordered otherwise, if this judgment imposes imprisonment, payment of criminal monetary penalties is due during imprisonment. All criminal monetary penalties, except those payments made through the Federal Bureau of Prisons' Inmate Financial Responsibility Program, are made to the Clerk of the Court.

The defendant shall receive credit for all payments previously made toward any criminal monetary penalties imposed.

Payments shall be applied in the following order: (1) assessment (2) restitution principal (3) restitution interest (4) fine principal (5) fine interest (6) community restitution (7) penalties and (8) costs, including cost of prosecution and court costs.

Nothing in the court's order shall prohibit the collection of any judgment, fine, or special assessment by the United States.
