STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION,
CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

Tony Thurmond was sworn in as the 28th California State Superintendent of Public Instruction on January 7, 2019. Superintendent Thurmond is an educator, social worker, and public school parent, who has served the people of California for more than ten years in elected office. Previously, he served on the Richmond City Council, West Contra Costa Unified School Board, and in the California State Assembly representing District 15.

Much of Superintendent Thurmond's social service work has focused on improving the services provided to foster youth and directing programs that provide job training to at-risk youth. He also led programs to provide help for individuals with developmental disabilities. He has 12 years of direct experience in education, teaching life skills classes, after school programs, and career training.



KATHERINE NEAS
DEPUTY ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF SPECIAL EDUCATION AND
REHABILITATIVE SERVICES (OSERS), U.S. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

Katherine Neas is delegated the authority to perform the functions and duties of the Assistant Secretary, Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services, at the U.S. Department of Education. In this capacity, she serves as advisor to the U.S. secretary of education on matters related to the education of children and youth with disabilities, as well as employment and community living for youth and adults with disabilities. The mission of her office is to improve early childhood, educational, and employment outcomes, and to raise expectations for all people with disabilities, their families, their communities, and the nation. Deputy Assistant Secretary Neas will deliver a live and interactive video keynote presentation on September 14th.



DR. ATUL NAKHASI, MD, MPP SENIOR ADVISOR FOR THE OFFICE OF THE U.S. SURGEON GENERAL

Dr. Atul Nakhasi, MD, MPP, serves as Senior Advisor for the Office of the U.S. Surgeon General. The Office's core priorities are centered on addressing the youth mental health crisis and combating the nation's epidemic of loneliness and social isolation. Dr. Nakhasi also serves as a primary care physician for the underserved communities of Watts/Compton at a government-rub public clinic in South Los Angeles.

During the initial stages of the pandemic, he also served as a frontline physician in the LA COVID Surge Hospital resurrected by the Governor. Dr. Nakhasi attended Johns Hopkins School of Medicine for his medical degree and Harvard Kennedy School of Government for his public policy degree, where he was named a Fellow at the Harvard Center for Public Leadership. He has been featured in the Washington Post, Wall Street Journal, ABC World News, Good Morning America, MSNBC, and CNN. He originally hails from Iowa, born and raised amongst cows and cornfields in the Midwest.



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JANE ELLIOT
AMERICAN DIVERSITY EDUCATOR

Jane Elliott, internationally known teacher, lecturer, diversity trainer, is a recipient of the National Mental Health Association Award for Excellence in Education.

In response to the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr. in 1968, Jane Elliott devised the controversial and startling, "Blue Eyes/Brown Eyes Exercise." This, now famous, exercise labels participants as inferior or superior based solely upon the color of their eyes and exposes them to the experience of being a minority. Everyone who is exposed to Jane Elliott's work, be it through a lecture, workshop, or video, is dramatically affected by it.



MARLON MORGAN
CEO & FOUNDER OF WELLNESS TOGETHER

Marlon Morgan is the Founder & CEO of the California-based national nonprofit organization, Wellness Together School Mental Health. He works with school districts, universities, state offices of education, and the U.S. Department of Education to increase awareness, advocacy, and access to mental health interventions for students, families, and school staff. Marlon is a curriculum consultant for Harvard Medical School and works with leading corporations including Amazon.com to support employee mental well-being. He has received special recognition from the U.S. Congress, California State Senate, and the California State Assembly for his innovative work promoting mental health and wellness in education. Marlon is also an honorary faculty member at the USC Suzanne Dworak-Peck School of Social Work.

Marlon began his career as a school counselor and a Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor, creating student support programs for underserved students in an effort to close the achievement gap. He was appointed by the California State Superintendent of Public Instruction (SSPI) in 2016 to develop policy recommendations for the SSPI and the California State Legislature.



DR. JASON HEUSTIS SCIENTIST, EDUCATOR, AND HIGHER EDUCATION ADMINISTRATOR

Dr. Jason Heustis serves as the Director of Student Development and Training Evaluation for Graduate Education at Harvard Medical School, where he is also Lecturer in the Department of Biological Chemistry and Molecular Pharmacology.

Dr. Heustis teaches graduate students, develops skills-building curriculum, deploys career preparation programming, connects students to resources for their personal well-being and professional success, and assesses graduate student learning and development. He has worked extensively on outreach and recruitment efforts focused on undergraduate students and also taught at the undergraduate level.



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CHRIS GETHARD COMEDIAN, ACTOR, AND AUTHOR

Chris Gethard is a comedian, actor, and author. He's the host of the Beautiful/ Anonymous podcast, the former host of The Chris Gethard Show, and wrote and starred in the HBO special Career Suicide. He also hosts the podcast New Jersey Is The World, a celebration of his home state.

Chris has been seen on television shows such as Space Force, The Office, Broad City, Parks and Recreation, and Inside Amy Schumer. He's also been seen in films such as The Other Guys, The Heat, Ghostbusters, Anchorman 2, and was one of the stars of Mike Birbiglia's Don't Think Twice. Chris can most recently be seen in the HBO Max documentary Class Action Park.



DR. PAUL GOTHOLD SAN DIEGO COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Dr. Paul Gothold has more than 27 years in K-12 education, with a focus on building school systems with equity at the core. He has a proven track record of supporting quality professional learning for teachers, backing innovative ideas, and putting students first. Since being named San Diego County Superintendent of Schools in 2017, Gothold and the SDCOE team have worked to find alternatives to detention initiatives, and, through partnership with the district attorney's office, juvenile courts, and probation, the county has reduced the criminalization of youth from over 600 students incarcerated to less than 100 in three and a half years. Gothold has experience as a teacher of adjudicated youth and an adjunct professor, and serves as a mentor and advisor for sitting and aspiring superintendents throughout the state.

Dr. Lamont A. Jackson is the Superintendent of the San Diego Unified School District. Dr. Jackson is a San Diego native who not only graduated from the San Diego Unified School District but has been an employee with SDUSD for over 30 years.

Dear County and District Superintendents, Charter School Administrators, and High School Principals:

Student Mental Wellness Conference: Promoting Student and Staff Mental Wellness and Improving School Climate

I am excited to invite you to the Sixth Annual Student Mental Wellness Conference: Promoting Student and Staff Mental Wellness and Improving School Climate, sponsored by Wellness Together School Mental Health and the California Department of Education (CDE). The conference will be held in person at the San Diego Convention Center on September 14–15, 2022, with an option for virtual attendance.

We know that many students, family members, and school staff were struggling with mental health issues well before the onset of the pandemic. Systemic inequities in our educational, health care, and economic systems had already caused major disparities in education and health outcomes for children of color and children living in conditions of poverty. The unimaginable impacts of the pandemic in vulnerable communities have left our schools facing an unprecedented wellness crisis. In addition, the consequences of social isolation and learning loss caused in part by prolonged school closures have led the U.S. Surgeon General to declare a mental health state of emergency for our nation's children.

There has never been a more important moment for us to come together to gather strength, share resources, and elevate the priority of student and staff mental health. I urge you to consider sending a team from your county, district, and/or school site to this important convening, which will focus on fostering healing and building the foundation of wellness for our school communities. The conference will include workshops, panels, and presentations from leading experts at the intersection of educational, familial, and communal mental health. Conference attendees will also have a chance to learn how to expand best practices, establish networks of support, and maximize community mental health resources in the school setting.

I am proud that the CDE is co-hosting this event with Wellness Together, and I encourage the participation of local educational agencies from across our state.
