During the events, our law enforcement and safety partners provide Mecklenburg County residents an opportunity to properly dispose of old, unused, or outdated prescription medication in an environmentally and legally safe method. The purpose of the event is to bring awareness to the increasing trend of prescription drug poisonings and bring awareness to the risk of disposal into the local environment.

Independent public health experts agree that properly disposing of prescription medications is essential to the fight against the opioid epidemic. According to the National Survey on Drug Use and Health, nearly 54 percent of those who misused prescription drugs obtained them from a friend or relative.¹ The Geisinger Center for Health Research found that only about 11% of unused medication is disposed of properly.² Further, the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine recommendations include the need for improved consumer access to convenient and year-round drug take-back opportunities to reduce the amount of unused medications available for misuse.³
