OUR PURPOSE

The Enterprising Women Foundation
Mentoring Program provides Columbia
Secondary School high school girls with an opportunity to meet and connect with outstanding women entrepreneurs in their community at a local event—scheduled after school hours—designed to recognize their leadership potential, inspire them to dream big, and focus on the next steps to realize their potential as entrepreneurs or leaders in STEM-based fields and other industries.

Enterprising Women is a partner in the Million Women Mentors Project and has committed to bringing a focus on opportunities in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) to high school girls who may not have role models or mentors. Over the next 20 years, STEM-based industries will lead the way and participation among girls is still lagging in technology, engineering, and related fields.

In communities where mentorship programs do exist, the Enterprising Women Foundation Program provides existing mentoring programs for high school young women with a unique resource to enhance their programming. Participants will have the opportunity to meet and learn from highly successful women entrepreneurs and corporate leaders from a wide range of industries—many from STEM-based fields.



THE PROGRAM

The event program provides a highly interactive environment. The format includes a panel discussion featuring successful women entrepreneurs and partners with diverse backgrounds sharing their stories and answering questions from the high school girls.

Following the panel discussion, we will feature roundtable mentorship discussions in small groups with the high school girls seated at tables based on their interest areas (for example, girls interested in technology would be seated with women entrepreneurs with technology expertise).

The girls should come prepared with questions to ask about career choices, entrepreneurship, leadership, or related issues.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY

Two girls from Columbia Secondary School will receive a scholarship to attend the Annual Enterprising Women of the Year Awards Celebration & Conference in Clearwater, Florida from May 21-22. The scholarship includes airfare, transportation, hotel (Wyndham Grand), meals, and a gift card for incidentals for each girl and one parent or adult chaperone. Guardians can attend all events with the girls, if they choose.

The girls will have an opportunity to meet highly successful women entrepreneurs and leaders from around the world. The girls will participate in a unique program developed specifically for them which includes inspiring speakers, the opportunity to meet in one-on-one mentorship sessions targeted to their areas of interest, ask questions of women business owners and leaders, and participate in special workshops.



Girls from Columbia Secondary School are eligible to be nominated for this scholarship opportunity by registering to attend. A panel of women entrepreneurs from their community, and teachers, will make the final recommendation on the scholarship recipients.

Scholarship winners will be announced following the event. An alternate will be selected. Winners must be in attendance.

PROGRAM AGENDA

The program runs for 2.5 to 3 hours after school.

- Welcome and Introductions (10 Minutes)
- Mentor Panel Discussion Six diverse mentors, including women CEOs representing STEM fields, will share their experiences and take questions (30 Minutes)
- Refreshment Break (10 Minutes)
- Small Group Mentoring Roundtable Sessions -Ten to twelve mentors will each meet with approx. 6 students at a table and engage in discussion. Girls will switch tables half way through (30 Minutes)
- Financial Literacy Game Students will participate in the Nova Financial Lab Literacy Game (60 Minutes)
- Closing Remarks and Announcement of Scholarship Recipients (10 Minutes)
- Some mentors will remain to answer more questions (15 - 30 Minutes)

THE FINANCIAL LITERACY GAME
